Message from the Chairperson



The Asian River Restoration Network (ARRN) is going to complete the activities of the second year of the foundation. We'd like to report our activities of this year in the Annual Report 2008 and express our deep gratitude to all people concerned including the members for their support.

As one of the major activities of ARRN in 2008, our report says that two standing committees, the Information Committee and Technical Committee, were established and they started operations. In September 2008, both committees held the first committee meeting in the China Institute of Water Resources and Hydropower Research (IWHR) in Beijing, China. On Nov. 4, the 5th International Forum on Waterfront and Watershed Restoration was held in Tsinghua University in Beijing. This forum was held as a special session of the 4th international conference of the Asia Pacific Association of Hydrology and Water Resources. Because this forum was held as part of the international conference of the 4th APHW, the area of expertise of the attendees seemed widened. They showed a keen interest in habitat conservation, watershed restoration, and water environment conservation in cities. In the past, we held such a forum only in Japan, but we noticed that collaboration with international institutes is important through these activities.

Following the international forum, the 3rd governing council meeting was held at the China Institute of Water Resources and Hydropower Research (IWHR) in the afternoon of the same day. In the meeting, amendment of the charter was discussed because new standing committees were established in 2008. The issues for which a final agreement was not achieved will be discussed next year. Concerning the pending river restoration guideline, it was decided to include the subjects of not only restoration of the natural environment but also urban river restoration and water quality improvement in the guideline. This is because these two abovementioned subjects are big river problems to be solved in large cities in Asia. ARRN announced that it will compile a river restoration guideline for Asia before the 5th World Water Forum. Additionally, it was also confirmed

that each member country is conducting activities smoothly.

As our international activities, we held the ARRN River Environment Symposium at the University of Tokyo in September 2008. Two vice chairmen of the International Association of Hydraulic Engineering and Research were invited to deliver a lecture on recent ecohydraulics and environmental hydraulics. Also, as JRRN became a member of the Network of Asian River Basin Organizations (NARBO), the activities of ARRN are increasing toward genuine internationalization. We are making utmost efforts to obtain international evaluation by improving our website and newsletter and responding to members' requests. We would appreciate your kind understanding and cooperation.

It has already been two year since Asian River Restoration Network (ARRN) was established. While at the same time, IWHR has also been promoting international cooperation and communication in the fields of river protection and restoration, sending out experts to attend various international conferences and important water events, such as World Water Forum, and has achieved satisfactory results.

Asian River Restoration Network provides a golden platform for sharing the latest information, good practice and promoting mutual understanding, and cooperation among experts and scholars from all over the world. It is our firm belief that ARRN will contribute to the sustainable development of Asian rivers and thereby contribute to the wellbeing of human beings and our rivers. We are sharing the same world.

KRRN: Korea River Restoration Network

Two years have passed since Asian River Restoration Network (ARRN) was organized by the leadership of Prof. Nobuyuki Tamai and some others in Japan. Recently, we had the third governing council meeting at China Institute of Water Resources and Hydropower (IWHR), which means ARRN has been well established and performed as expected.

In 2008, Korea River Restoration Network (KRRN) had a few activities including the 4th International Workshop on River Environment (June 2~4, 2008, Ilsan) and the 6th Annual Joint Seminar between Korea and Japan on Ecology and Civil Engineering (August 18 ~ 19, 2008; Jinju), both of which were strongly supported by KRRN and myself. Also, in 2008 KRRN launched two special committees, as directed by ARRN. They are Information Committee which Dr. Hong Koo Yeo in KICT leads and Technical Committee which Dr. Kyu-Chang Oh in Dongbu Engineering Co. leads.

In Korea, on-coming years will be a golden days for river restoration. The Government of Korea has launched about ten billion US dollar river restoration projects in January of 2009. The four major rivers, including the Han River and Nakdong River, are the targets of large-scale river restoration focusing the enhancement of aesthetic values of the river in urban areas and restoration of flood conveyance and ecological integrity of the river in suburban and mountainous areas. In addition, several new dams will be built for storing water and control floods in along with that about 100 existing agricultural-purpose dams will be reinforced to enlarge their storage capacity, which is essential to releasing environmental flows downstream. The project will end in 2014. In planning and designing the project, specialists from KRRN as well as various sectors of academia and practice are being involved.

Finally, KRRN will more actively work in 2009 after its organizational base is shifted from KICT to KRA (Koreas River Association), which is more restoration-oriented non-profit organization in Korea. We firmly believe that KRRN will contribute to the sustainable development of the Asian rivers as well as the Korean ones and thereby contribute to the wellbeing of people living with the rivers.

About ARRN



Background of ARRN Establishment

Besides the object of flood control and water use, primarily rivers support human life as a resource for agriculture, fishery, and navigation, forming the core of social life and productive activities. However, as the population concentrated along rivers in high economic growth, the purification capacity of rivers was impaired. Consequently, water quality worsened, and the river environment, history and culture were lost. In many regions in Asia, similar social problems have surfaced recently.

Meanwhile, in Europe and America, advanced approaches have been taken to restore original properties of rivers such as the ecosystem and purifying capacity. Also in Asia, many reports start to arrive on the cases of restoring river functions to regenerate river environment where new values in rivers can be found. As such situations go on, some open organization needs to be established around for Asian regions which have similar climate and topography, for the purpose of exchanging information, methods, publications, and academic experts related to river/watershed restoration, and of mutually brewing technologies to restore and preserve high-quality environment.

In the "River Restoration in Asian Monsoon Region" session cosponsored by three countries of China, Korea, and Japan that was held in the 4th World Water Forum in Mexico City in March 2006, the necessity of cooperation among Asian countries was emphasized, and it was recommended that a network and a database should be established to exchange information on river/watershed restoration, and that a technical guideline specifically suitable for the Asian monsoon region should be developed. As a response to this recommendation, the "3rd International Forum on Waterfront and Watershed Restoration" was held in Tokyo in November 2006, and "Asian River Restoration Network (ARRN)" was formally established by concerned organizations of China, Korea and Japan.

Objectives

ARRN aims to contribute to the creation of rich Asian water environment for the following two purposes as a non political organization.


- To establish a mechanism to exchange and share case studies, information, technologies, and experiences related to river/waterfront restoration in the world and in the Asian countries, with engineers, researchers, ecologists, government officials and citizens through events and websites.
- To establish a river/watershed restoration guideline that can be utilized in the Asian monsoon area with similar social and natural environment, and improve knowledge and skills of network participants.



Activities

ARRN carries out following activities to achieve the above-mentioned objectives.

- Holds international forums and workshops with agendum of river/watershed.
- Publicize information related to waterfront restoration through websites and news letters.
- Prepares and distributes guidelines related to river/watershed restoration.
- Assists plans to dispatch lecturers and experts, and site tours among networks in counties and regions.
- Carries out activities of survey/researches, publication, public relations related to river environment.

ARRN Website



Formulating a Guideline on River / Watershed Restoration

At the nature restoration session in The 4th World Water Forum, necessity to develop an international network and to formulate a draft river restoration guideline was proposed. In response to this, formulating a draft guideline for river/watershed restoration in Asian region is being positioned as an important role of ARRN, who is currently working on this task.

In 2008 onward, ARRN Technical Committee consisting of experts from three countries of China, Korea and Japan will have regular discussions on formulation of the guideline. Such results will be made to the public periodically.

Target people: Those engaged in river/watershed restoration in Asian countries.

Content: Based on the guideline established in the session on Nature

Restoration at the 3rd World Water Forum in March 2003, ARRN expands the content by incorporating viewpoints and case introductions of urban river restoration as a specific feature of

Asia.

Structure: ARRN Secretariat incorporates and summarizes the results of

discussion of ARRN Technical Committee consisting of experts

from China, Korea and Japan.

Others: Progress of guideline formulation will be posted on ARRN website.

Interim report will be publicized proactively on the occasion of

the World Water Forum and such.

As a basis of formulating the guideline, ARRN has collected existing guidelines on river restoration to reach about 70 kinds. ARRN Secretariat will improve the web environment in order that these existing guidelines can be accessed.

On January 9, 2008, ARRN/JRRN Secretariat and the Secretariat of NARBO (Network of Asian River Basin Organization) had a meeting to exchange opinions. NARBO is an international network established in 2004 with the objective of promoting integrated water resources management (IWRM). ARRN expects cooperation

with NARBO will further be enhanced in the field of water environment restoration.

Information exchange with the Secretariat of PEMSEA (January 9, 2008, Tokyo, JAPAN)



On January 9, 2008, ARRN/JRRN Secretariat and the Secretariat of PEMSEA (Partnerships in Environmental Management for the Seas of East Asia) had a meeting to exchange opinions. PEMSEA is an

international organization that carries out projects financed by the world largest environmental fund GEF under the control of the United Nations Development Plan (UNDP). PEMSEA provides technical assistance and expertise for projects conducted in East Asia. Future cooperation between ARRN and PEMSEA is expected as coastal management cannot be separated from inland watershed management.

Attending the 3rd NARBO General Assembly (February 22, 2008, Solo, INDONESIA)

On February 22, 2008, General Assembly of the 3rd NARBO (Network of Asian River Basin Organization) was held in Surakarta, Indonesia, in which JRRN became a member of NARBO. Activities of ARRN were introduced in the Workshop held concurrently with the General Assembly.

Information exchange with the Center for Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration, Korea (May 28, 2008, Tokyo, JAPAN)



On May 28, 2008, delegates from the Center for Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration visited Japan. ARRN Secretariat and delegates exchanged opinions on Japanese political measures, researches, and projects related to river restoration.

The Center for Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration was established by

the Korean Ministry of Environment in November 2007. The Center plans to carry out 16 projects related to water environment restoration by 2014, each implemented by a joint-venture team consisting of a university and a private company selected from an open competition. It is expected that there will be further information exchange between the Center for Aquatic Ecosystem Restoration and ARRN in the field of river restoration.

Assisting delegates from Korea River Association (June 4, 2008, Ishikawa, JAPAN)

From 4 - 8 June, 2008, 41 members of delegation from the Korea River Association visited Japan to learn rivers and watersheds in Ishikawa Prefecture and surrounding Hokuriku region. ARRN Secretariat coordinated with concerned organizations on the Japanese side (such as Kaga City Government, Civil Engineering Division of Ishikawa Prefecture Government, Komatsu/Kaga Water Village Restoration Committee, Hokuriku Ecology and Civil Engineering Society, etc.), and Prof. Tamai, the chairperson of ARRN, joined the tour to the Sai River that flows through Kanazawa City. The study tour to restoration sites on rivers and water villages in Hokuriku region was a success in consolidating Korea-Japan relations in the field of river environment restoration.

Information exchange with Dr. Ulrica Åberg, the researcher from the School of Environment, University of Leeds, UK (June 26, 2008, Tokyo, JAPAN)



On June 26, 2008, ARRN Secretariat had a meeting with Dr. Ulrica Åberg, the researcher of the School of Environment, University of Leeds, UK. As a part of his research to compare river restoration projects between Japan and Europe, Dr. Ulrica Åberg conducted field studies to collect examples and information during her short

stay in Japan. ARRN Secretariat provided information regarding historical development of Japanese river environment administration, representative measures and examples, procedures for river restoration projects, and evaluation of the projects implemented in the past. She in turn explained current situations regarding river restoration in UK.

Information exchange with "Citizen's Group to Create Healthy Dorimcheon", Korea (July 15, 2008, Tokyo, JAPAN)

14 members including the representative of "Citizen's Group to Create Healthy Dorimcheon" visited Japan and exchanged information with ARRN Secretariat. "Citizen's Group to Create Healthy Dorimcheon" was established in 1999 and has expanded its members as much as 300. The objectives of its activities are to protect the environment of Dorimcheon basin and Gwanak-gu area with support of local citizens, and to pursue sustainable society and co-existence of nature and mankind for the betterment of people's lives. In the discussion, ARRN Secretariat introduced historical development of Japanese river environment administration, current projects for river restoration, and proactive efforts made by citizens including children towards restoring rivers. The Dorimcheon NPO in turn introduced activities carried out by children and then both parties vigorously exchanged information.

CRRN: China River Restoration Network

CRRN Website

CRRN has registered a website http://www.crrn.asia. This website is under construction and will be in operation next year. State of the arts in Chinese river restoration, esp. the technical progresses in these aspects will be introduced and generalized on this Website.

Ongoing Research Project

Decision Support System for Adaptive Management of River Restoration Project

The Ministry of Water Resources has authorized and supplied financial supports for the research topic on Decision Support System for Adaptive Management of River Restoration Project. This project is being undertaken by China Institute of Water Resources and Hydropower Research. Main tasks in this project include the establishment of fundamental database, knowledge database, model database, application technology development of WebGis platform and the integration of different models. These models will include physical-chemical assessment model, hydrological assessment model, biological assessment model, habitat assessment model, and socioeconomic and ecological holistic assessment model. Based on these achievements, technical supports will be carried for the planning, implementation and evaluation of river restoration project.

Chinese Guideline for river restoration

On the basis of current situations in China and state of the arts in river restoration, Chinese guideline for river restoration is under compilation in order to guide river restoration practices around different areas of China. Besides Chinese achievements in river restoration, advanced technologies and experiences of foreign countries are referred such as Japan, Korea, USA, UK, Australia, etc. The contents of the guideline include investigation, planning, design, monitoring, assessment and management. This guideline will be a great help to promote Chinese practices in a scientific and reasonable way.

Awarded Project

The research project, titled Theory Research and Demonstration Projects of River Restoration in China, got the first grade award of Dayu Award on Progress in Hydraulic Science and Technology issued by the Ministry of Water Resources this year. This project is fulfilled by China Institute of Water Resources and Hydropower Research, Department of Water Resources of Zhejiang Province and Department of Water Affaires of Shenzhen City. Main contents of this project include the following seven aspects.

- Ecological influence and mechanism analysis of hydraulic and hydroelectric projects.
- Planning and evaluation of river ecological restoration projects.
- Ecological hydraulics for the evaluation of river training works.
- Restoration techniques of river corridors.
- Reservoir re-operation technologies for downstream ecological benefits.
- Ecological technologies to treat polluted water bodies.
- Construction and evaluation of 5 demonstration projects.

From the 2nd to the 4th of June 2008, the 4th International Workshop on River Environment was held in the Korea Institute of Construction Technology, Ilsan with a support of KRRN. Under the theme of "Prospects for the River Restoration Technique Harmonizing with Flood Control and River Environment", the invited specialists were presented about river restoration of his or her country. They held a discussion on river restoration in urban area.

News of KRRN

By the guidance of ARRN in 2008, KRRN launched two committees. One is Information Committee which Dr. Hong Koo Yeo (KICT) leads and the other is Technical Committee which Dr. Kyu-Chang Oh (Dongbu Eng. Co) leads. They surveyed various technical manuals on river restoration in Korea and introduced them to ARRN.

Representative organization of KRRN has been changed from KICT (Korea Institute of Construction Technology) to KRA (Korea River Association). KRA (http://www.riverlove.or.kr) is the most relevantly associated with river in Korea. President of KRA is Dr. Kugil Kim. It was established in 2004, and now has members of about 1,000, and 13 technical and administrative committees including River Environment Committee. KRRN will work in KRA as a special committee. Secretary-General of KRRN has also been changed from Dr. Hyoseop Woo to Dr. Changwan Kim (both of them work in KICT), who worked as a secretary in KRRN.

■Event Planning/Holding


We plan various events to raise awareness and recognition of river/watershed restoration among public. We also take these opportunities to expand JRRN activities.

■Cooperation with Asian Countries








Menu of JRRN website

Governing Council



Recommendation made by the Nature Restoration Session of the 4th World Water Forum (March 2006, Mexico)

The "River Restoration in Asian Monsoon Region" session on 4th World Water Form was cosponsored by three countries of China, Japan and Korea. In the session, panel discussion was held between the representatives of Malaysia and UNESCI-IHE additionally to that of three countries. At the end of the discussion, following terms were proposed as the conclusion. In response to this recommendation, Asian River Restoration Network (ARRN) was established in November 2006.

- It has been realized that river restoration is of vital importance to socio-economic sustainable development in parallel with flood management and water use management.
- It is necessary to recognize that the basin as a basic unit for management, that the river environment is dynamic, and that the environment of the various rivers is maintained by dynamic disturbance.
- It is necessary for the countries in Asian monsoon region to establish the suitable methodology and technology for river restoration, considering dense population, frequent and severe flooding, and abundant rice paddy.
- In Asian monsoon region human-influence to a cultural landscape is harmonized with the ecosystem traditionally. Those landscapes that have been modified by humans over long periods are often also important for nature as well as culture.
- It is important to develop a database and Asian network of projects and knowledge of international experts in river restoration. River restoration is a multi-disciplinary and multi-organizational task that should be supported by river engineers, environmental scientists, ecologists, water managers and the public.
- It is urgent to establish a river restoration guideline suitable for the Asian monsoon region as a reference for countries with similar social and natural conditions.
